Town Mayors Charity

Throughout his year as Town Mayor in 2013/2014, Councillor John Staveley-Churton raised a fantastic £2900 for his chosen charities, The Sheffield Children's Hospital 'Make it Better' appeal and other local causes. For the forthcoming year, Cllr. Staveley-Churton will be supporting BIRT (Brain Injury Rehabilitation Trust) which has a centre in Goole Hospital, and various projects in Snaith and Cowick.



Working in conjunction with the Yorkshire Ambulance Service, Cllr. Staveley-Churton and other members of the Town Council have also secured the first Defibrillator machine for the area, which is located on the Town Council office wall next to the Fire Station.

Snaith Youth Club

As recently announced in the local press, Snaith & Cowick Town Council will be taking control of the Snaith Youth Club, after the East Riding of Yorkshire Council confirmed its withdrawal of support to the group due to budget cuts. Snaith & Cowick Town Council were concerned about the impact of losing this service on the local youth community, and are therefore looking forward to taking on this exciting project.

The plan is to create a new Snaith & Cowick Voluntary Youth club to serve the young people in the community for the foreseeable future. The Town Council will also employ two youth workers on a one-year contract to help with the change.

Using funding secured to date, the Goole GoFar project will also provide a mini-bus service for young people using the new club.

It is hoped that the new club will be in operation by mid to late October 2014. Snaith & Cowick Town Council would also like to take this opportunity to thank retiring staff Marjorie McBride, Pat Firn and Peter Williams for all their hard work and support in making the previous Snaith Youth Club such a successful venture.

Princess Diana Play Park

It has been agreed by the Town Council that new play equipment can be procured for the Princess Diana Play Park on South Parkway. Aimed at the Under-5's, the existing climbing frame and swing-set will be fully refurbished, along with a new roundabout and a new spring see-saw. It is hoped that this will be completed over the next few months so watch this space!

Snaith & Cowick Town Council - How we support the Community

The Town Council is conscious that the local community may not be fully aware of what it is striving to deliver to both Snaith and Cowick, and how it supports its residents. To try and answer some of your concerns, we've briefly outlined some of the key responsibilities below, along with other initiatives and projects which the Council are supporting.

What your Town Council is responsible for;

From a Precept of £80,000 per annum received from the East Riding of Yorkshire Council, some key functions we deliver are;

- Maintenance of 32 Parish Paths
- Maintenance of street lighting
- CCTV Monitoring
- Maintenance of Play Areas, namely the Joint Use Play Area next to the Primary School, and The Princess Diana Play Park (aimed at Under-5's) on South Parkway
- Maintenance of the Snaith, Cowick and Gowdall Cemetery
- Working on large projects such as the proposed new property developments in Snaith, ensuring local views are listened to and taken into consideration
- Liaison with bodies such as the East Riding of Yorkshire Council and the Environment Agency to report resident issues such as potholes, damage to public property, traffic issues and more major concerns such as the flooding at Snaith Ings
- Offer Grants and Funding to local community groups
- Street Cleaning
- Maintenance of council-owned property, such as the Town Lock-ups
- Gritting and snow removal of prominent paths during severe winter weather, managed through Emergency Plans maintained by the Council
- Provision of benches and picnic benches at places of interest
- Control and gain income from Recycling facilities
- Retention of the ATM in Snaith
- Management of staff including Youth Workers, office staff, Cemetery Clerk and Street Sweeper

Recent Achievements, Projects & Initiatives;

Snaith Ings - Reinforcements to the riverbank to prevent flooding are due to start this Autumn and continue into 2015.

Snaith Youth Club - Taking control from the East Riding of Yorkshire Council to secure facilities for the younger members of the community.

Securing the refurbishment and new play equipment for the Princess Diana Play Park. Successful community events such as the Christmas and Summer Markets.

Securing the first Defibrillator for the Town Centre.

On-going discussions with the Charities Commission to take over the running of the East Cowick Village Hall.
