As an introduction to the 15 Heritage Walks, a special 6 mile guided heritage walk has been created. Our guide will entertain you with stories about the ups and downs of five wealthy families who had strong links with royalty and influenced the lives of ordinary people in Snaith. The walking is easy going on pavements, riverside flood banks and field tracks. There are no stiles.

Play Areas

There are four Play Areas for children in Snaith.

Owned and maintained by the Town Council, this area has play equipment suitable for the use of younger children

Brierley Close Play Area is at the entrance to the estate.

Punton Walk PlayArea is about half way into the estate. Both are owned and maintained by the East Riding of Yorkshire Council.

The new picnic area in Snaith was completed in June 2014 when a sculpture and information board about the life cycle of a butterfly designed by the children of Snaith Primary School with artist Steve Tomlinson, was installed.
