

## WALK DETAILS 6.25 m/10km

GRADE: Moderate A mixture of field paths, tracks and a small amount of road walking.

#### **SUMMARY**

After passing across Snaith Ings you enter East Cowick through Lidgate and cross the M62 into open countryside before eventually joining the Trans Pennine Trail back in to Snaith.

# 3 THE LOST RIVER

# FEATURES OF INTEREST POINT 2-3



As you walk away from Snaith across Snaith Ings, to the north above the trees you will see the tower of Carlton Towers, part of the Duke of Norfolk's estate. See the card for walk 8 for more information.

To the South you will have excellent views of Cowick Hall. built circa 1670 by Viscount Downe. The Dawnay family had been resident in Cowick for about 200 years, Sir John Dawnay was Steward of the Kings House in Cowick in 1493. In 1680 Charles II gave the then Sir John Dawnay the title of Viscount Downe. The architect of the house is not known but it was the first Renaissance 'Italian' House in the North of England. The HERITAGE BOARD near the main gate, junction of A1041 and Lodge Lane, tells vou much more about the history of Cowick Hall. POINT 3-4

As you walk along, you are walking parallel to the old course

of the River Don, which is approx 200 yards to the east. The HERITAGE BOARD near the old toll Bridge tells the story of this lost river.



At Point 4 a short stroll along the road towards Goole will take you to the small road bridge over the course of the river. This was the medieval crossing point of the River Don.

#### POINT 7-8

Once again, you are walking Parallel to The Lost River, about 200 yards to the east.



### POINT 12

In West Cowick you will pass the old brewery and a little further on there is a HERITAGE BOARD with information about the brewery and other Cowick highlights.
