Snaith, Cowick and Rawcliffe Covid-19 Community Support Group

This group is now a fully established, independent Community Interest Company (CIC) managed by 4 Directors from our parish. The CIC is also supported by a fantastic group of local volunteers who are giving up their time to help those in need.

Snaith and Cowick Floods - February 2020

Whilst Coronavirus may be at the forefront of our minds at the moment, we must not forget that many of our residents are also still living in the aftermath of the devastating floods which hit our community on Tuesday 25 February and the days afterwards.

Both the East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) and the Town Council are still here to support those residents and help in any way we can.

The ERYC have now launched an independent enquiry - called a Section 19 Report - into the disaster. Residents are encouraged to

submit any evidence they have (photographs, videos or just general information) to the following address;

Paul Abbott, Head of Housing, Transportation and Public Protection at ERYC has said " We really want to hear from people affected by the recent flooding in the Snaith and East Cowick area – they may have photos or videos of the flooding and its effects, and we would like them to share them with us, or indeed any information that they feel might be useful. The investigation is an opportunity for the local community to get fully involved, and help to shape the final report which we produce, which will include recommendations for the future." When the report into the flooding has been completed and has gone through consultation, it will be approved by the ERYC's Cabinet and then formally published.

The Town Council are currently preparing their own submission to the enquiry.

East Riding of Yorkshire Council Services

The East Riding of Yorkshire Council are still operating their usual services although some may be on a reduced scale.

- Household Recycling Sites have now re-opened.
- Grass cutting of public land has now recommenced in key areas
