Snaith, Cowick and Rawcliffe Covid-19 Community Support Group

Snaith and Cowick Floods - February 2020

Whilst Coronavirus may be at the forefront of our minds at the moment, we must not forget that many of our residents are also still living in the aftermath of the devastating floods which hit our community on Tuesday 25 February and the days afterwards.

Both the East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) and the Town Council are still here to support those residents and help in any way we can.

The ERYC have now launched an independent enquiry - called a Section 19 Report - into the disaster. Residents are encouraged to submit any evidence they have (photographs, videos or just general information) to the following address;

East Riding of Yorkshire Council Services

The East Riding of Yorkshire Council has also reopened its Customer Service Centres to the public, which includes the one in Goole, but please note that this is on an appointment-only basis. Please take this into consideration if you need to visit the centre.

Many of the operational services have now resumed but please bear in mind that due to social distancing restrictions, some may be working at a reduced capacity.

- Waste and Recycling bin collections are still continuing as per the normal schedule
- Household Recycling Sites are open but queues may be likely as numbers are being restricted during busy periods.
- ERYC Libraries reopened on Monday 10 August but access could be restricted at busy times and time spent inside the Library will be limited. Masks must be worn. On-line services are also available at www.eastridinglibraries.co.uk/libraries-online/

Remembrance Parade

Chapel to pay their respects on behalf of the whole community.

Wreaths will be laid in remembrance of the fallen during the service at the Methodist Chapel, and then at both the War Memorial on Beast Fair and the Pollington Airfield Memorial Garden.

Christmas Market & Christmas Lights Switch-on 2020

Following a discussion by Council Members at the Town Council meeting in September, it is with great sadness that we advise the Snaith & Cowick Christmas Market will not be going ahead this year. This was a unanimous decision of all Councillors, with the safety of stallholders and the visiting public our primary concern.

In light of the on-going pandemic and the uncertainty of what social distancing measures will likely be in December it is felt that this is the best decision to make in the interest of all involved. We are already aware of certain restrictions which, for example, would prevent us from using The Priory Church as a venue for stalls and we appreciate that this is usually such an integral part of our event. There are also other logistical considerations which have been taken into account (including a limit on the number of stalls we could safely have due to space) and on reflection, the practicalities of implementing these are just too big for us to be able to guarantee the safety of both stallholders and the visiting public.

We are sure you will share in our disappointment, but we are thinking positively that we will be able to return safely in 2021 with an even bigger and better Christmas Market.



Freedom of Snaith Parade 2021

Every three years, the RAF 51 Squadron hold a full military parade through the town as part of their 'Freedom of Snaith', which was granted to them in recognition of their affiliation with Snaith in WWII. The next parade is due to take place in 2021 and we are pleased to announce that this event will be held on Sunday 21 March. Further details will be released nearer the time but please put this date in your diary. It is hoped that the Parade will be able to take place in its usual format, but this will obviously depend on advice provided by the Government nearer the time.

Humberside Police & Street Surgeries

Since the pandemic first hit in March, our local PCSO Sam Chandler has still been visible around the parish, responding to incidents of crime and anti-social behaviour throughout the pandemic. She has also held a number of Street Surgeries, in conjunction with both Town and Ward Councillors.

Normal Police Surgeries are now set to resume at the council office in November, with social distancing measures implemented. These will take place as follows:

Green Food Waste Caddy Liners

Whilst the council office continues to operate on an appointment-only basis, residents can still pick up a roll of the green food bags from the box outside our office. Please can we request that residents only take 1 roll at a time as supplies can run out quickly and we cannot always guarantee a quick resupply from the ERYC.

Kealey's Butchers and The Paper Shop also have a supply should you not be able to obtain any from the council.

Fly-Tipping

The Town Council have noted an increase in reports of fly-tipping during Lockdown, which have been reported to the relevant authorities. Some of these reports have included the disposal of garden waste into land behind residential properties. Please can we remind all residents that this is also classed as fly-tipping, whether it be on to private or public land, and there is the potential for prosecution if you are caught doing so.

If you observe fly-tipping, you can report this direct to the East Riding of Yorkshire Council by visiting their website (www.eastriding.gov.uk) and entering Fly Tipping into the search engine.

Dog Fouling

With an increase in residents using our Parish Paths to exercise, the council has noted a rise in the number of complaints received regarding dog fouling.

Please can we remind all dog-owners that it is their responsibility to pick up after their pet and dispose of the bag properly in one of the many litter bins. Leaving the bag on the ground is still subject to the same penalties as not cleaning up at all.

- Pontefract Road (at the junction with Punton Walk)
- At the top of Bourn Mill Balk Road (next to Playing Fields)
- Saffron Drive (at the junction with Villa Fields)
- Mill Lane, West Cowick
